University Librarian Search Discussion.

We discussed what opportunities there will be for library staff to provide feedback during the UL search.

Data Repository Discussion.

Mary summarized her visit with GODAN and asked what needs for data repositories other disciplines might be seeing.

Updates.

Mary: the PSEC instruction fellowship will be re-posted in January; The Vet library position is posted; Mann's AS position will be reposted; The search for head of RS is proceeding.

Curtis: the Science and technology director position search is proceeding; Presented at LEG on CornellTech; Update on ATHM

Bonna: liaison steering com. is working on goals; DH space proposal approved—in 701; Shelving workflows; Next Thursday: 125th anniversary of Uris

Kornelia: FAL project is moving forward, although we still don't know when the collection will be moved to the Annex temporarily; Visited Weill last week—there are a lot of possibilities for collaboration between Mann/Vet and Weill, especially in the areas of systematic reviews and clinical librarianship. The VIVO team at Weill has built a citation tracking visualization tool which uses weighted citation numbers to account for differences in disciplines and year of publication. Kornelia will connect them with our Scholars@Cornell team. Received a budget from PTAC on the cost of the self-release card readers for all printers in all libraries. In discussion with Ezra. Is going to the ARL Forum in DC this week.

Fine Arts Library Updates September 2016:

- Discussion are ongoing as to when the building project of the New Fine Arts Library will begin.
- This fall semester the Fine Arts Library (FAL) are offering three workshops:
 - **Navigating Library Resources (offered September 21, September 22, November 1 and November 2 from 5-6pm in the Fine Arts Library Conference Room, 300 Rand Hall):**
An one-hour overview of the collections and organization at the Fine Arts Library. This workshop will include quick tips for searching the library catalog for books, journals,

articles, indexes, theses, images, and data resources, as well as information on document delivery and borrowing materials from other libraries. – Taught by Martha Walker

- **Artstor 101 (offered October 5 and October 12 from 5-6pm in the Fine Arts Library Conference Room, 300 Rand Hall):** Participants will learn how to use Artstor's digital content with useful pointers about browsing, tips for basic search techniques, and methods to refine your search results. There will discuss the ins and outs of the keyword search, browsing by media, collection, or geography, advanced search, filtered results, and more. – Taught by Marsha Taichman
 - **GIS 101 (offered September 28 and September 29 from 5-6pm in the Fine Arts Library Conference Room, 300 Rand Hall):**
This session will be a brief overview of *Tableau*, *SimplyMap*, *Social Explorer* and *Carto*. Participants will need to download free versions of software in advance of the workshop to follow along. -- Taught by Boris Hristov Michev
- Two book launch events will take place this semester. This is in collaboration with the Department of Architecture.
 - The first will be on 10/3/16. Two faculty members have a new book published by Routledge on "Model Perspectives."
 - The second book launch will be on 10/13/16. The topic will be "Women Architects in India." (This will be one of the kick off events for the India Symposium the Department of Architecture are hosting that weekend.)
 - In addition to assisting in book launch events, the FAL will be hosting an exhibit of titles on architecture in India. The Architecture Department is designing a special display case for the exhibit that they are proposing to install temporarily at the FAL. Martha Walker is working with Architecture Department in developing a bibliography for distribution to Symposium participants.

Music Library Updates September 2016:

- The library has designated additional carrels for graduate study to meet the growing requests of grad students and visiting scholars – there are now a total of 19 assigned carrels.
