Microfilm TF

Bonna and Jim LeBlanc have been co-sponsoring a task force, consisting of representatives from O/U Stacks Management, LTS, LIT, the Annex, and O/U RLS to review, make recommendations, and send as much of the Olin microfilm collection to the Annex as possible. In their first year, more than 35,000 reels of some 93,000 reels have been sent. We have asked the group to update their charge and continue working for another year.
