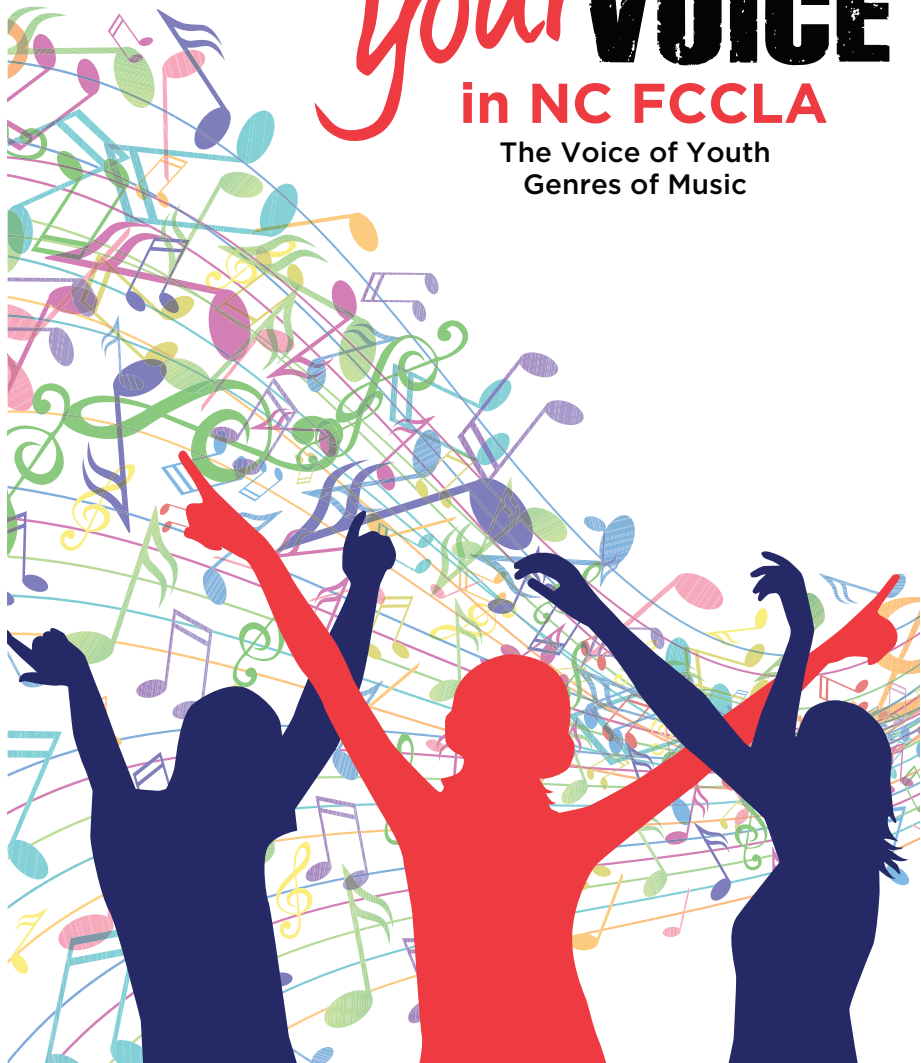

MEETING GUIDELINES AND TIPS

As a delegate to the NC-FCCLA State Leadership Conference, you have been provided a special privilege to represent your family, school, community, chapter and state. This places great responsibility upon you to be a credit to yourself and to the persons who have placed their confidence, faith, and trust in you. Therefore, each delegate needs to adhere to all of the guidelines/policies for the conference.

MEETING POLICIES

- Name badges must be worn when attending sessions and are required for all sessions.
- Please be on time for all sessions and remain until meetings are adjourned.
- Wristbands for the conference must be worn at all times, if lost a new one **MUST** be purchased.
- Wear your name badge at all times while in the hotel and convention center. Do not wear name badge out in public, if lost you **MUST** purchase a new one.
- Use of the alcoholic beverages , controlled or illegal substances and firearms or fireworks is prohibited.
- Persons of the opposite sex are not to occupy lodging rooms at the same time.

TIPS FOR DRESS

- Dress appropriately for meetings and other functions. Shorts, t-shirts, or halters are not appropriate dress for the meeting. Absolutely **NO JEANS** or denim clothing should be worn during the conference. Keep the draperies drawn in your room while dressing. Remember that your dress and behavior reflect the image of NC-FCCLA members.
- Professional business attire during general sessions and workshops - for males, includes suits, sport coats, or sweaters worn with slacks, dress shirt, and tie; for females, suits, dresses, or skirt and blouse, suit jackets, sweaters, and coordinated dress pants outfits (**no denim-jeans**). Be sure to wear appropriate shoes (no tennis shoes, no flip-flops).
- Pajamas and tank tops are not to be worn anywhere in the hotel other than in your hotel room. No tie string pants of any type outside of the room.
- Advisers should check to make sure all students are appropriately attired at all times.
- Business “casual” is appropriate for travel and touring.
- **At the Awards Ceremony**, all competitors **MUST** be appropriately dressed (NO denim, low cut tops, tank tops, hats and/or flip flops) or they will not be allowed to walk across the stage during the award ceremony but will be asked to walk around the back of the auditorium to the opposite side of the stage. Competitors will be asked to remove gum before crossing the stage. These rules will be enforced, **NO EXCEPTIONS ALLOWED.**

DELEGATE SAFETY TIPS

- Never travel alone – stay in groups and walk in well-lit areas.
- Advisers and chaperones must know where you are at all times.
- Do not talk to or give money to strangers.
- Bolt your hotel room door. Open it only when you know who is on the other side. All hotel staff will be in uniform. If in doubt, call for hotel security to come and verify the employee's identify.
- Know where stairs are located in case of fire. (Do not use elevators).
- Never give your room number to someone you do not know.
- Remove your name badge when outside the convention center and meeting hotel.
- Keep your money and other valuables with you. Do not leave them in the room.
- Students should be courteous and professional throughout the entire conference.
- Anyone breaking any guideline may be removed from the conference. Advisers, parents, and school administration will be notified of any inappropriate behavior.
- Notify chapter adviser (day or night) in case of an accident, illness, or any suspicious behavior.

COURTESY & BEHAVIOR

- Observe curfew each evening by being in your assigned hotel room and quiet.
- Keep noise in hotel hallways, sleeping rooms, and public areas to a minimum, avoid disturbing other guests.
- Conference delegates are guests of the hotel and must not deface or destroy hotel property. Do not throw anything from windows or over balconies. **The individual or chapter responsible will pay for damages to any property or furnishings in the hotel or conference area.**
- Refrain from language and actions that are rude and inappropriate.
- Delegates must be in their rooms and quiet by the 11:30 pm curfew. Advisers and chaperones will check halls and rooms each night. Delegates must not engage in horseplay at any time (i.e. running, water fights, etc)
