Updates

<u>Eric</u>

Africana Library:

- RMC purchased the archive of Wilbert Tatum (1933-2009), who was variously owner, editor, publisher, and executive officer of the New York Amsterdam News. Two years ago RMC received the photo archive of this important African-American weekly newspaper that serves the New York City region. This new batch of papers provides the textual component to the Amsterdam News photo archive.
- Eric Acree received the 2015 Cook Award. This award recognizes the contributions of members of the Cornell community for their contributions to improving the climate for women on our campus.
- Eric Acree was the one of the keynote speakers at the "Dining With Diverse Minds Dinner." The topic was "Preventing Sexual Violence." A write-up appeared in the <u>Cornell Daily Sun</u>
- Eric Acree taking part in the planning of a one day Faculty Symposium on the Role of Faculty in Addressing Sexual Violence on College Campuses, April 28th.
- Held screening of the *Eyes on the Prize: Bridge to Freedom, 1965*. This program documented the March 7th, 1965 march in Selma, Alabama, where southern Blacks were seeking laws to allow them to vote. Among the discussants was Dorothy Cotton, Riche Richardson, and Russell Rickford.
- In collaboration with ASRC and the Africana Library, there is a weekly film series taking place in honor of the late ASRC Professor Ali Mazuri. This will end in April 2015.
