





FAST SUBJECT HEADINGS (FACETED APPLICATION OF SUBJECT TERMINOLOGY)

- FAST has been developed in large part to attempt to meet the perceived need for a general-use subject terminology scheme which is:
 - Simple to learn and apply
 - Faceted-navigation-friendly
 - Modern in its design

An Access query of OKU bib records with a disc-type mention in the $\pm e$ in the 300 field but no 867 for supplemental material in the holdings.

Of the 218 records addressed 10% had issues:

- Thirteen or 5.96% were lacking marking and tattle tape
- Nine or 4.13% were now lacking the disc which may have needed to be claimed or has now gone missing!

Let's examine the book regardless of whether or not there's a ‡e.



Or if easier replace with the correct diacritic if not too overwhelming and you feel confident. This is not really a dNIC situation because it's a glitch in our database, not a problem with the record.





SERIES CLASSED CALL NUMBER

These are similar to the previous slide, except they are based on the subject of the <u>series</u>, so they are more general. They have a label (no., V., Bd., Heft, etc.) and number at the end which comes from the $4xx \pm v$ field. Reject if the label is missing.
