
### Delivery

#### Share


- Publish collections into a robust discovery workspace that provides a single point of access to your local content and the <u>Artstor Digital Library</u>'s 2+ million images in the arts and sciences
- Publish and promote your content on <u>Shared</u>
   <u>Shelf Commons</u>, an open-access library of digital media
- Set viewing and download size of published images
- Create curated digital exhibitions using the <u>Omeka</u> plugin
- Use Artstor's Open API to publish to an institutional repository or OAI harvesting to publish to a discovery platform
- Collaborate with the community through shared name and work records








