Cornell's Entrepreneurial Activity in Ithaca

Overall Data Analysis Tompkins County

The Data for New York State is complete, below is a brief summary of Tompkins County Highlights.

- In Tompkins County, a total of 141 companies were found by Cornellians from 2006-2011
- 130 of which were established in Ithaca, and 45 companies were founded by College of Engineering Alumni & Faculty.
- 576 employees were reportedly hired in Tompkins County, and 368 patents were issued to
 those companies, the patent total leads all regions of NY State for Cornellian founded
 companies in this time frame.
- \$48.4M in investment capital was also raised in the Ithaca area in total, of which \$8.3M was raised in 2010.
- *Based on Entrepreneurship Survey September 2011 by SRI with all Cornell faculty, alumni.


Economic Activity in Tompkins County Cornell Start ups

According to research conducted for the *Index of Economic Activity for Tompkins County* and the Tompkins County Planning Department, approximately **1300** jobs were created and added to the workforce between 2006 and 2011. **576** of these were created at newly established companies founded by Cornell Alumni, Staff and Faculty.

New Economic Initiatives Business and Community Partnerships

Three Initiatives:

- Southern Tier Innovation Hot Spot
- Downtown Ithaca Incubator (TC3, Ithaca, Cornell)
- START-UP NY

Southern Tier Innovation Hot Spot

The proposed Southern Tier Innovation Hot Spot is a partnership between **Cornell University** (lead), the region's largest research institution, **Binghamton University**, the region's flagship SUNY campus, and **Corning Incorporated**, the region's largest private company and largest source of commercial innovation.

 If we win, there is a \$375,000 annual state fund provided to operate the Hot Spot (for three years)

The Downtown Ithaca Incubator Home "node" of Southern Tier Network

- · Central location with entrepreneurial support and mentoring
- Operated by Cornell with deep engagement from partner institutions Ithaca College and TC3; all 3 schools have committed to provide initial funding—efforts are underway to find long term support (\$1M application to state to cover renovation costs)
- Focus on student-founded companies, giving them a place within the region to "graduate to"
- Open to qualifying startups regardless of institutional affiliation
- Programming will include events to help new business formation, and support and mentoring to help startups raise capital, grow and thrive.

START-UP NY

Announced by Governor Cuomo, passed by legislature, and effective January 2014:

START-UP NY program to "foster entrepreneurialism and job creation on a large scale by transforming public higher education through tax-free communities across the state, particularly upstate"

START-UP NY

- Participating companies in START-UP NY will not pay any taxes (e.g. business/corporate taxes, sales taxes and property taxes) for 10 years
- Employees in participating companies will pay no income taxes for the first five years
- Mary Opperman chairs the Planning Committee that is organizing Cornell's response to STARTUP NY
- Have identified initial land for consideration

The Future

- Cornell Tech has brought visibility to the entrepreneurial spirit of Cornell grads
- Cornell has committed to many activities to exploit this disruptive opportunity and grow our future for the next 30 years
- State is investing heavily in startups to stimulate new companies and job growth
