

CASA-SEVILLA GENERAL HEALTH & SAFETY EMERGENCY PROTOCOL (SPRING '24)

An emergency is a situation where the health, safety and well-being of a student are in immediate danger. Emergencies can occur on the individual or group level. CASA-Sevilla on-site staff is responsible for supporting the safety and well-being of all program participants. To that end, that person or group of people will do whatever is necessary and possible in a crisis to protect students. This responsibility may, at times, appear to conflict with the values or respect for the student's individual autonomy and independence. In matters relating to personal safety, the authority of the governing body (e.g., Cornell's International Travel Health and Safety Team, the U.S. State Department, Program Director, Embassy, national policy) will supersede the individual wishes of students.

1. Health and Safety Emergency Protocol

- **Threat to life, limb, or eye** — call an ambulance! The local emergency number is:112.
- If **victim of a crime or sexual assault**, if safe to do so, contact the local police to report the incident and get immediate help. The local emergency number is: 112. If you need medical assistance, it is important that you go to Hospital de la Mujer (Hospital Universitario Virgen del Rocío): <https://www.hospitaluvrocio.es> within the 72 hours after the assault.
- For **any type of emergency** or if you need help and don't know what to do:

- In the event of **terrorism, a violent uprising, or natural disaster**:
 - Shelter in a safe place and monitor the advice of local authorities
 - For U.S. Citizens, the DoS will notify and advise you (first by email) if you enrolled through [STEP](#), the Smart Traveler Enrollment Program. Non-U.S. citizens can also sign up to receive travel alerts

and advisories by email but will not have access to the same emergency services. It is advisable to check with your own Embassy for similar programs.
