Compilation vs. Collaboration Decision Tree




Chart #2: Compilation, 1 Creator
Interim local guidelines:
For compilations by a single author other than compilations of musical or legal works, do not give a conventional collective title, and do not create a work or expression authority record for the compilation. For example, neither "The supernatural stories of Charles Dickens" nor "The beggar maid : stories of Flo and Rose" should get a 240 field with "Short stories. Selections". Code such records as encoding level 7; do so even if they are otherwise full level

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
